
What are the results?

- Nationwide Statistics for AVID Students (2010):
 - 51% of AVID 8th graders pass Algebra vs. only 22% of non-AVID students.
 - 91% of AVID students in Illinois complete college entrance requirements.
 compared to just 36% of students in the nation.
 - 98% of AVID seniors go to college vs.
 47% of all seniors in California.



Why does AVID work?

- The AVID elective class works because it:
 - redefines the teacher's role to that of an advocate and coach,
 - places students into rigorous courses and provides them with the support needed to succeed,
 - develops the habits and life skills needed to be successful, *and*
 - builds positive peer relationships and a greater sense of belonging for students.



Who should apply?

- Students who have the "Individual Determination" to attend college, be a leader, and strive to, or already ...
 - behave appropriately in class,
 - attend school on a regular basis,
 - possess a 2.0—3.5 GPA,
 - will enroll in honors classes,
 - will work hard to set and meet academic goals, and
 - will actively participate in AVID events.
- Students who meet one or more of the following criteria:
 - Will be the first in their family to attend college
 - -Are from a population traditionally underserved in 4-year colleges
 - May have special circumstances to be considered. (i.e. teacher recommendations, etc.)

What is AVID?

AVID stands for $\underline{\mathbf{A}}$ dvancement $\underline{\mathbf{V}}$ ia $\underline{\mathbf{I}}$ ndividual $\underline{\mathbf{D}}$ etermination, and it is an academic elective class for determined 6th—12th graders. Students must apply, interview, and be admitted before enrolling.

AVID's mission is to ensure that all students, especially those students traditionally underserved in education:

- will succeed in rigorous curriculum,
- will complete a rigorous college prep, accelerated and honors path,
- will increase their enrollment in 4-year colleges and universities, and
- will become educated, responsible participants and leaders in our society.

The AVID curriculum revolves around building student skills through the following instructional practices:

WICR

- Writing to Learn.

emphasizes writing in all subjects with a focus on clarifying and communicating thoughts and understanding of material.

- <u>Inquiry</u>.

involves useful, skillful questioning that allows students to clarify, analyze, and synthesize curriculum.

- Collaboration.

fosters responsibility in students by actively engaging them in the learning process.

- Reading to Learn:

focuses on skills needed to access rigorous text and the skills of analyzing, questioning, critiquing, clarifying, and comprehending material.

Tutorials

- These collaborative study groups are led by trained tutors and secondary school role models currently enrolled in or alumni of local colleges and universities.
- Tutors work with students in these small, peer-led groups, providing coaching in academics and organization in all curricular areas.

Enrichment & Motivation

- Students take exploratory trips to colleges, universities, and cultural events.
- Guest speakers from various careers and colleges present information that helps students develop future goals.
